


Online residency and course selection will be open on January 14 through January 24, 2020

1. Log into PowerSchool using your parent account


If you do not have your Powerschool username and password, please contact Kyle Johnson at kjohnson@mchs.net with your student's name and grade level. You will receive an email with your username and password within 2-3 days. Please note: a computer kiosk is available at Central & South Campus for those families that do not have computer/Internet access at home.



2. Once you are logged into PowerSchool on the right-hand side you will see click here and choose SchoolForms to complete the Online Residency; click on the box with the arrow.




3. Click SchoolForms




4. You will now begin the Residency process by clicking on "Residency"

All students/families must provide Minooka Community High School District #111 with two acceptable proofs of residency. A detailed listing of what items are acceptable proofs of residency can be found on the orange informational sheet. You will be able to submit these items electronically as part of this process, but please note that you must have these items available at the time you register online, as you are not able to log back in to the system to submit them at a later time. If you are unable to submit these items electronically, please complete the enclosed orange informational sheet and return the sheet and your proofs of residency to the high school main office at either campus. Enter all of the required information on each form and click **Save Form**. Continue through each form until you have completed the residency process. The last screen will inform you that you have completed the residency process. Be sure to click Confirm Form to Complete on the confirmation page before you click Save Form.

5. Once the online residency process is completed, and you have hit the "submit" button, you will be taken to the following window. Please click on "Sign in to ClassChoice" to complete Part 2 of the Residency and ClassChoice process.

IMPORTANT! Before you begin, please make sure you have your course selection sheet.

1. Click on **Add Special**

This is where you will find resource. Any class with a [2] behind the name means it is a second semester course. If you register for Band and/or Choir you must select a Resource also. You may register for both Band and Choir. *Disclaimer-If you choose to register for 8 classes (no resource), a guidance counselor will take your course selection and try to accommodate your request to the best of their ability.*

If there is a special request class you want to take, click the box next to the course(s) name, and then click Save Requests. If you did not add any classes, you will still need to click save requests to move on to the next page.

2. Click on **Add Core**, add your core classes, and then click on Save Requests. (Please note that you only need to sign-up for the first semester of that particular course. The program will automatically register you for the second semester.) On this page you will see required core classes listed, such as English, Math, Science, and Social Studies.

Please refer to your course selection sheet to ensure you request the correct level of each core. Don't worry about making a mistake; your counselor will meet with you individually to review your selections. After you have selected your core courses, click on Save Requests. If you have not completed selecting your core classes, the program will not allow you to add elective courses.


3. Click on **Add Electives**, choose an elective area from the drop down menu, and then click on Save Requests.

NOTE: In order to enroll in Nutrition and Foods I and II in the same school year, the student must first click on Nutrition and Foods I, then click save requests, then go back in to Add Electives to add Nutrition and Foods II. This step is required for all courses that have a pre-requisite.

If you register for Band or Choir you must select a resource also. *Disclaimer- If you choose to register for 8 classes (no resource), a guidance counselor will take your course selection and try to accommodate your request to the best of their ability.*

The red bar in the middle of the screen will gradually turn to green as you complete your course requests. Once you have chosen 16 courses, the bar will be entirely green and your schedule is full. (You are finished!)

All sophomore, junior, & senior students interested in Driver's Education at Minooka Community High School during 2020-21 School Year

Fall 2020 & Spring 2021

- **Students must have successfully completed 8 credit hours** in the previous 2 semesters.
- Students are enrolled in 1st or 2nd semester driver's education based on their birthday. Oldest students in 1st semester/younger students in 2nd semester. Typically, if your birthday is before February 1st you get placed in 1st semester, if your birthday is after February 1st you get placed in 2nd semester. This varies slightly each year. All students must be 15 years by the time they take their permit test.
- The testing for the permit applications for students enrolled in Fall 2020 will be Tuesday April 21st through Friday April 24th. Students will receive their Rules of the Road booklet Monday 4/6 or Tuesday 4/7. All students will get their Rules of the Road booklets and do their testing during their Physical Education or Health class.
- Spring Driver's Ed students would do their permit testing in November 2020 and receive their permits at the beginning of December.
- Cost for Driver's Education during the school year is \$175.

Summer Driver Ed 2020

- **Must pass 8 credit hours** in the previous 2 semesters.
- Summer Driver Ed 2020 begins Wednesday, May 27th and ends Tuesday, June 23rd. **The classroom portion meets the minimum number of days to meet the state requirements, so if you miss class you must make it up. You can miss and make up a max of 3 days, absences over 3 days results in being dropped and failure of the course. THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS RULE!**
- Registration begins today Wednesday, January 8th and ends Friday, February 28th. **Please note that registration is processed on a first-come, first-served basis, and seats are limited.**

- The testing for the permit applications for students enrolled in Summer DE 2020 will be Tuesday, April 21st through Friday, April 24th. All students must be 15 years by the time they take their permit test. Students will receive all information and Rules of the Road booklets at the mandatory parent & student meeting at South Campus on April 8th at 7:00pm.
- Please take home the Summer Driver's Education Parent letter explaining the registration process and the expectations for Summer Driver's Ed.
- Cost for Summer Driver's Education is \$325 (cheaper than private driving schools)
